



# Latin America and Caribbean Regional Situation Report

#### **Situation Overview**

COVID-19 Cases: 1,553,142 COVID-19 Deaths: 76,729

Latin America is experiencing an extremely complex situation, as COVID-19 cases are rising sharply and without reaching a plateau, according to the WHO. The total number of confirmed cases in the 15 countries where World Vision operates add up to over 1.5 million as of June 14th, equivalent to almost a fifth of the global cases.

Brazil and Peru together represent 13% of the cases worldwide. However, Mexico, Chile, Guatemala, Nicaragua and Haiti are of special concern due to steep increases of new cases and deaths. The beginning of the hurricane season is intensifying risks for highly vulnerable populations and posing further pressure over the already saturated emergency and health services. The first tropical storm killed 14 people in El Salvador and forced thousands of families to relocate in shelters in Central America, amid the social distancing and quarantine measures.

Additionally, the deportation of sick migrant people from the US is also factoring in the increase of cases in this sub-region. World Vision is calling for immediate financial aid to sustain its response, as additional distress will come from the severe deterioration of livelihoods for millions of families.





#### **Achievements**

World Vision's response to the emergency has already benefitted 6 million vulnerable people, including over 2 million children in 15 countries. Our reach is leveraged by our community presence and the mobilization of over 26,000 church leaders.

WorldVision launched a <u>study</u> that delves into the harsh reality of children, adolescents and young migrants and refugees from Venezuela who are caught up in the economic and political crisis now made worse by the COVID-19 pandemic.
