Empowered Worldview

Most people never think about their own worldview (most people do not think about breathing, either). How do I know what I know? What is knowable? Who controls my destiny? What is my relationship to nature? Why do I think I can improve my life? Does my life matter?

World Vision's goal in our work is to see people move out of extreme poverty and vulnerability to fullness of life – able to provide for themselves and their children and communities with dignity and hope. To make that transformation, people need to believe that they can and should make that move. In confronting profound dis-empowerment and dependency for improved well-being upon spirits of ancestors or spirits of rivers or forests, or upon governments or organizations like our own, World Vision has discovered that it is imperative to help people understand the Biblical foundations of an empowered worldview.

In North America, a Biblically-based "Empowered Worldview" is challenged by secularism. In Africa and other parts of the world, the challenge comes from animism (click <u>here</u> for more information).

The "Empowered Worldview" is a curriculum which addresses some critical and core issues related to worldview. These include:

- Who am I? This is the probably most critical set of issues. This is the core of the Empowered Worldview. Most of this is found in the first few chapters of Genesis. You are created by God. You are so valuable that God has redeemed you. You belong to God. You are an image bearer of God. You are gifted by God. You are accountable to God for yourself, for your marriage and your family, for your community, for caring for creation. You are therefore capable, creative, productive, and have agency.
- What is my vision for myself, my family, and my community? This deals with people living together in harmony and community. It deals with benefiting from the fruit of my labor without being trapped by greed, exploitation, or oppression. It deals with God's concern with the poor. It deals with the benefits of working hard. It deals with creating wealth and

opportunity, and providing for oneself. It addresses the spiritual roots of poverty and how it can be confronted.

- Why is showing compassion to others important? Since God sees the world with compassion, as image bearers of God, showing compassion allows us to be our real selves. Treating the poor and marginalized with compassion, acting on their behalf, and using our wealth to help others reflects God's image in our lives.
- How should I treat others? Seeing the world as God sees it lets us treat people the right way. This begins with myself, but extends to how we treat the poor, women and men, and the outcast. We treat them as we would want to be treated and as people made by God and in God's image.



The "Empowered Worldview" is the foundation of a "quartet" of social and spiritual empowerment tools that World Vision uses with faith leaders and churches, families, and community groups holding government accountable and responsible. These include Celebrating Families, Channels of Hope, and Citizens' Voice in Action (click <u>here</u> for more information).

The "Empowered Worldview" is resulting in profound changes in individuals, families, and communities, as people realize that as a person created in the image of God, they have been gifted and empowered by God to work hard and lift themselves out of poverty. They have power. They can create a loving family. They can help their neighbors. They can become all that God intends them to be. They can THRIVE!
