This provides an update on World Vision water efforts to address the global water crisis.

# World Vision Water Update: August 2017



## **Mid-Year Results**

Our mid-year results show that we are on track with our overall goals to provide clean water and sanitation to everyone everywhere we work by 2030 including reaching 20 million people with clean water by 2020. Importantly, we continue to reach one new person with clean water every 10 seconds. These results are our best mid-year results in our history.

Specifically, in the first half of 2017, we provided 1.65 million people with clean water access, nearly 1 million people with improved sanitation, and reached 1.56 million people with hygiene education.

On average, every day we reached 9,065 people with safe water, nearly 10 villages were certified as open defecation free, and eight school water clubs were formed.

Some of the highlights of the mid-year results include reaching nearly a quarter-million people with clean water in both Syria and Ethiopia, and more than 100,000 people in Zimbabwe. We now have business plans that specify key deliverables for water, sanitation, and hygiene beneficiaries and the corresponding funding required to deliver these results for 44 countries including the recent addition of plans for Cambodia, Indonesia, Myanmar, Papua New Guinea, and the Philippines.
