In the remote rural communities of the developing world where World Vision works, more than half of the health clinics do not have running water or basic hand washing facilities. Additionally, there are not enough community health workers (CHWs) to cover communities.

LEADING IN HEALTH


In 2019, World Vision joined a global effort to upgrade health facilities and by 2023 had upgraded more **2,000** healthcare facilities: more than any other NGO.
