

OUR PROMISE TO YOU

For every donation of \$12.5K, we will report back to you to show you the impact that your donation is making by providing a report of a specific water point that you have helped fund. This will include a photo with GPS coordinates, and the number of people who have benefited from your gift. We will typically be able to provide the report in 12 months.



WHAT IS A WATER POINT?

Water systems are constructed from a water source. The source is pumped into a distribution network to reach the end users through individual water points. Each water system is either protected or treated to ensure it is safe for users to drink. The number of water-points created in a system depends on the yield of each water source, or how much water is flowing. High yield sources can have many distribution points, while low yield sources may only have two or three.

Our standard is to ensure that every community member has access to water within 30 minutes roundtrip of their home, including the waiting time at the water point. This means that the number of water points we have in a specific area will vary by population and geography. On average, we estimate about 200-300 people are served by each water point. Therefore, depending on the yield of the system, many thousands of people could be served by one complete system.

Reports are offered in Kenya and Rwanda for 100 water points in each country.

Activities include: helping people build and maintain latrines, promoting handwashing with soap, and establishing open defecation free communities. When combined, water, sanitation, and hygiene interventions can reduce child disease and death, support child protection and access to education, and reduce gender disparities.
