Water in Schools

THE NEED



In the remote rural areas where World Vision works, half of schools do not have clean water on premises and only 1 out of 8 have basic handwashing facilities. Globally, there are 546 million children who attend schools that have no water access, and an even greater number of children go to schools that lack basic hygiene or sanitation.

Children either have to bring their own water to school or go without, and many do not have access to safe water at home. The unhygienic conditions of schools without water, sanitation, and hygiene make learning difficult. Many girls drop out of school because of the lack of an ability to manage their periods at school.

Imagine the hardship of being a teacher in a school with no water and poor hygiene.

WHAT WE'RE DOING



World Vision provides clean water access on the premises of schools, and, when needed, we also provide hand-washing facilities and separate latrines for boys and girls. We not only provide the upgraded infrastructure but work with students to help them adopt healthy behaviors including hand-washing.

World Vision is a leader in providing water, sanitation, and hygiene in schools and every year upgrades more than 1,000 schools serving more than half a million children.
