










Lillian believed she was worthy of more. The night before her cutting ceremony, Lillian and a group of girls ran away.




CHILD MARRIAGE AND FGM





"According to traditional Pokot culture, no girl will be accepted to get married if they have not gone through female genital mutilation."






A daughter's worth is tied to her bride price, money that can be the difference between survival and starvation for families in extreme poverty.

shifts against FGM and child marriage.




MOBILIZING FAITH LEADERS
