## Protecting lives, restoring dignity, and renewing hope

Natural disasters like hurricanes and earthquakes can strike without warning, claiming thousands of lives in seconds. Man-made crises such as war and political instability unfold over time, ultimately putting millions at risk. A humanitarian crisis delivers the heaviest blow to the most vulnerable especially children—often in the world's toughest places.

In fiscal year 2021, World Vision responded to 72 emergencies in 52 countries, providing essential services to 30.1 million people. In addition, our 71-country COVID-19 response had reached nearly 76 million people by January 2022. We're distinctively capable of responding quickly, collaboratively, and holistically to virtually any emergency anywhere in the world.

Motivated by the love of Jesus, our crisis response team continually monitors global developments so we're ready to respond to the greatest needs—including disasters that get little U.S. news coverage.

#### What is our approach?



Before

Before emergencies happen, we work with communities to develop disaster preparedness plans that map out local threats and identify how to save lives and protect property—increasing families' readiness and resilience.



**During** 

When a crisis hits, our global staff activate pre-established logistical assessments, plans, and programming protocols and begin shipping and distribution of pre-positioned supplies from warehouses strategically located worldwide to help children and families get the support they need.



After

**After the initial response**, we work alongside communities over the long term to establish permanent housing, sustainable sources of clean water, food security, access to quality education and healthcare, and recovery loans to rebuild livelihoods and restore children's sense of security.
